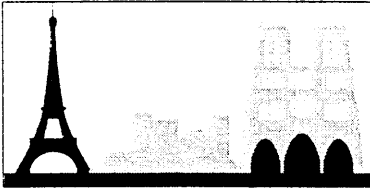

Upcoming Court Case about Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide

A very important court case is set to launch on November 14th in Vancouver. The BC Civil Liberties Association is seeking to legalize euthanasia and assisted suicide, via the court, in Canada in what is being referred to as the Carter/Taylor Case. The BCCLA is representing the family of Kay Carter, who died by assisted suicide at the Dignitas suicide center (Switzerland) in January 2010, and Gloria Taylor, who lives with ALS. Both parties are from BC.

Last year the Parliament of Canada rejected Bill C-384 that was sponsored by Quebec Member of Parliament Francine Lalonde (BQ) which would have legalized euthanasia and assisted suicide, by a vote of 228 to 59. Since then an all-party committee of Members of Parliament have been working on a report that will recommend ways that Canada needs to improve its care in the areas of: palliative care, suicide prevention, elder abuse and disability issues. The Parliamentary Committee on Palliative and Compassionate Care will release its report this month. Rather than wait for the report, the BC Civil Liberties Association court case seeks to change the law through the courts by challenging Canada's protection in law preventing euthanasia and assisted suicide.

The Carter case concerns the family of Kay Carter who accompanied their mother to Switzerland where she died by assisted suicide at the Dignitas suicide center. The claim states that Kay Carter's rights were violated by a law that prevented her from dying by euthanasia or assisted suicide in Canada. The claim also states that her daughters broke the law by assisting their mother to go to the Dignitas suicide center. The daughters believe that they could potentially be prosecuted by Canada's assisted suicide law which they consider to be unconstitutional.

Gloria Taylor, who lives with ALS, says that she wants to die by euthanasia or assisted suicide and the laws that prevent her from dying in this way are unconstitutional. In August, a case to legalize assisted suicide that was proposed by the BC group was thrown out by the judge. The Farewell Foundation was attempting to legalize "Swiss style" assisted suicide in Canada. They wanted the law to allow doctors and other people to be able to assist a suicide. The judge ruled that the foundation did not have a strong enough case to challenge the existing law. However, the judge invited the group to apply to intervene in the parallel right-to-die case led by the BC Civil Liberties Association. They were successful in this application. The Euthanasia Prevention Coalition (EPC) sought and was granted intervener status in the BCCLA case. EPC is based in Ontario, but the BC arm (EPCBC) is actively working, with assistance at the national level, to oppose the BC Civil Liberties position. CHABC (Catholic Health Association of British Columbia) was a founding member or EPCBC and continues to actively support its work.
