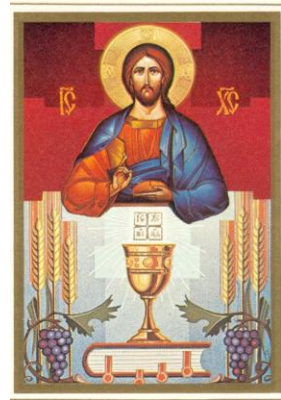

**Madonna House Summer Program – Living the Gospel with Madonna House Apostolate July 1 – August 15 2010.** Program theme for Summer 2010: The Kingdom is Near: Christ, Culture and You! There is no fee to stay at Madonna House, but all guests are asked to participate fully in the daily schedule of work, prayer, and recreation. The daily routine follows: We rise at 6:45 a.m. and gather together for Morning Prayer at 8:00 a.m. Breakfast of porridge, yogurt, brown bread and tea follows at 8:30. We go to our various working places at 9:00 and stay there until noon. Most of our work is manual: laundry, carpentry, gardening, canning, painting, cleaning, maintenance, washing dishes, etc. We have our main meal at noon, followed by spiritual reading in common, usually from the writings of the Fathers of the Church, spiritual writers, current events, the writings of the Pope as well as Catherine Doherty, our foundress. Work then continues from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. with a break in mid-afternoon for tea. Courses, lectures and study are often held in the late afternoon and early evening, depending on the season. We celebrate Mass at 5:15 p.m. The liturgy is the culmination of the entire day. As Catherine said, "We live our life between two Masses." At 6:00 p.m. we have supper, usually consisting of soup, a vegetable, cheese or grains. After supper we clean vegetables, wash dishes or do other chores. By 7:30 p.m., there may be a talk or dorm gathering, or free time. At 9:00 p.m., we gather again for tea and conversation. ### **Corpus Christi – The Body and Blood of Christ**



The Solemnity of *Corpus Christi* commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist, paralleling Maundy Thursday (Holy Thursday) commemorating Our Lord's institution of the Eucharist. *Corpus Christi* was introduced in the late 13th century to encourage the faithful to give special honour to the institution of the Holy Eucharist, to the Blessed Sacrament. The official title of this Solemnity was changed in 1970 to The Body and Blood of Christ (Latin: *Sollemnitatis Sanctissimi Corporis et Sanguinis Christi*); and it is still on the Roman Missal's official Calendar for the universal Church on Thursday after Trinity Sunday; however, where it is not a day of obligation (as in Canada) it is usually celebrated on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday.

#### **Catechism of the Catholic Church - The Eucharist §§ 1322 - 1419**

1324 The Eucharist is "source and summit of the Christian life." "The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch."

1325 "The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit."

1326 Finally, by the Eucharistic Celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all.

1327 In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: "Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking."

#### **ENCYCLICAL LETTER *ECCLESIA DE EUCHARISTIA* OF HIS HOLINESS POPE JOHN PAUL II TO THE BISHOPS PRIESTS AND DEACONS MEN AND WOMEN IN THE CONSECRATED LIFE AND ALL THE LAY FAITHFUL ON THE EUCHARIST IN ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE CHURCH**

The Church draws her life from the Eucharist. This truth does not simply express a daily experience of faith, but recapitulates the heart of the mystery of the Church. In a variety of ways she joyfully experiences the constant fulfilment of the promise: "Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age" (Mt 28:20), but in the Holy Eucharist, through the changing of bread and wine into the body and blood of the Lord, she rejoices in this presence with unique intensity. Ever since Pentecost, when the Church, the People of the New Covenant, began her pilgrim journey towards her heavenly homeland, the Divine Sacrament has continued to mark the passing of her days, filling them with confident hope.

The Second Vatican Council rightly proclaimed that the Eucharistic sacrifice is "the source and summit of the Christian life". "For the most holy Eucharist contains the Church's entire spiritual wealth: Christ himself, our passover and living bread. Through his own flesh, now made living and life-giving by the Holy Spirit, he offers life to men". Consequently the gaze of the Church is constantly turned to her Lord, present in the Sacrament of the Altar, in which she discovers the full manifestation of his boundless love.
