REV. HENRY CHIGOZIE NWAIMO

I was born into a family of seven (five male, two female), on the 10th day of October 1980. I was born in Eziudo Mbaise in Imo State, Nigeria, but grew up in the South-Eastern city of Aba, in Abia State, Nigeria, where my parents lived and served.

At the age of 12, I started my minor seminary education/training at the Annunciation Minor Seminary, Amaudara, Abia State, Nigeria

(1992-1998). At the end of my minor seminary education/training, I acquired the West African Senior School Certificate Examination result (WASSCE), which qualified me to proceed to the Diocesan Propaedeutic Spiritual Year Seminary of Azumini Ndoki (Aba Diocese), Nigeria (1999).

Upon my completion of my one year propaedeutic seminary training, I proceeded to the Seat of Wisdom Major Seminary, Owerri, Nigeria, for a four year philosophy course (2000-2004). I completed my philosophy course in 2004, acquiring a Bachelor's Degree in Philosophy (from the Pontifical Urban University, Rome) and another Bachelor's Degree in Arts (from the Imo State University, Owerri, Nigeria).

Afterwards, I continued my theological studies at the Good Shepherd Major Seminary, Kaduna, Nigeria (2004-2009), after which I got a Bachelor's Degree in Sacred Theology (Pontifical Urban University, Rome) and another Bachelor's Degree in Theology (University of Jos, Nigeria).

I was ordained as a Catholic priest on the 14th of August, 2010, after a one-year pastoral internship program/formation in the Diocese. After my priestly ordination, I have worked/served in the following Parishes/places:



HOLY WEEK IS THE MOST SACRED WEEK IN THE LITURGICAL YEAR.

It starts on Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday. This is the time observed with special solemnity as a time of devotion to the Passion of Jesus Christ. During this time we celebrate the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. We remember his actions, reflect on his messages and recommit to living as his disciples in the world today.

CHRISM MASS

Join Bishop Joseph and the priest of our Diocese on Tuesday, March 26, 2024 at 10 am During the Chrism Mass, Bishop Joseph will bless the oil of the sick and the oil of catechumen and consecrate the oil of chrism which will be used in the parishes of the diocese throughout the year. As our bishop blesses these three oils, our hearts turn to our gracious Lord who bestows His infinite love and mercy to us through these sacraments. Let us pray for our bishop and the priests who are the ministers of the sacraments in the parish, that they may be the humble and generous servants of the Lord. This Mass also acknowledges the ministry of priests as they renew the commitments they made at their ordination and receive the prayers and support of the people. All are invited to this special liturgy to pray especially for priests and for all who will be anointed by these oils in the coming year.

HOLY THURSDAY

This is the day on which Catholics commemorate the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, on the night of his betrayal. It is the first day of the celebration of Triduum.

This year Holy Thursday is on March 28. There will be a Mass at 7 pm followed by Adoration till midnight.

GOOD FRIDAY

Good Friday, the day on which Catholics annually observe the commemoration of the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ and his death at Calvary. It is observed during Holy Week as part of the Paschal Triduum.

This year Holy Friday is on March 29. There will be two services at 3 pm and 5:30 pm. The Passion of the Christ movie will be played at 6:45 pm in the Cathedral basement.

EASTER VIGIL

On this Holy night, the Church keeps watching, celebrating the resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. It is the turning point of the Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life. Easter Vigil starts outside with a fire and blessing of the New Easter Candle. Then, everyone walks into the Church with a lit candle.

This year Easter Vigil is on March 30. There will be a service at 8 pm.

EASTER SUNDAY

On this day, Catholics celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is the completion of the Holy Week. Jesus was raised from the dead, and it goes to show that He conquered sin and death.

This year Easter Sunday is on March 31. There will be three Masses at 8:30 am, 11:30 am, and 6 pm.
