

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Christ is truly present in the Eucharist in His sacred humanity united with His Divine nature. The Eucharist should receive the adoration that is given exclusively to God. Adoration of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is a natural consequence of the Church's faith in the Real Substantial presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Adoration allows for an intimate encounter with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. Eucharistic adoration enables us to spend time thanking Him for His sacrificial gift expressed in His Eucharistic words: "This is my body which is given for you" (Luke <u>22:19</u>). Eucharistic adoration brings the Faithful throughout the Catholic world together, to adore the same Lord present in every tabernacle. Does life seem burdensome? Adore Christ. Do you want to pause life and rest a while? Adore Christ. Do you have serious intentions for which to pray? Adore Christ. Does your family need strengthening? Adore Christ. Adoration of Christ is not to be left for other people to do. It is for all of us. Please, seriously consider taking time this Fall to adore Our Lord. Will you respond to Christ's invitation to sit with Him for a while?

What is Children's Liturgy of the Word?

Dear parents, grandparents and guardians, as we move into the Fall season we will once again offer Children's Liturgy. There are some

common misunderstandings regarding this important ministry which is offered for children ages 4-7. Those over 7 are at First Communion age and should be attending the full Mass. This includes older siblings who should also remain in the Church assembly. Children's Liturgy is about proclaiming and explaining the Word of God suitably adapted to make it relevant to young children. It gives them opportunity to understand the Gospel message and participate in the Eucharistic celebration at their own level The Liturgy of the Word for Children is not "Sunday school" or a catechetics class, nor is it meant to be a way of removing children from the assembly so that parents can concentrate on the Mass. Rather, the Liturgy of the Word for Children is a component of the ritual prayer of Mass just as it is for adults. Learning may take place during the Liturgy of the Word, but it is in the context of liturgical prayer. In fact, the Children's Liturgy of the Word should never be seen as separate from the Mass. It should flow with and in the greater celebration of the Sunday Mass. Although the children may be in a different space for the liturgy of the Word or at a different level of understanding, we should not think of them as having been "dismissed" from the assembly. When they are elsewhere, it is to enhance their inclusion in the liturgy, not separate them from it. We are thankful for the kind volunteers who generously give of their time to lead the Children's Liturgy. We are reminded that a rotation of adult leaders will ensure that no one will miss the Scripture Readings and homily on a frequent basis.

CANONANIZATION OF TWO SAINTS

On **September 7, 2025**, the Church will canonize **Blessed Carlo Acutis**, the first Millennial saint and "Cyber Apostle of the Eucharist," alongside **Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati**, known as "The Man of the Beatitudes."

You can watch the Canonization Mass for Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, to be aired from St. Peter's Square in Rome on September 7, 2025, at 3:00 AM ET or the replay at 6:00 PM ET.



Pier Giorgio Michelangelo Frassati was born in Turin, Italy on April 6, 1901. His mother, Adelaide Ametis, was a painter. His father Alfredo, was the founder and director of the newspaper, "La Stampa," and was influential inItalian politics, holding positions as an Italian Senator and Ambassador to Germany. At an early age, Pier Giorgio joined the Marian Sodality and the Apostleship of Prayer, and obtained permission to receive

daily Communion (which was rare at that time). He developed a deep spiritual life which he never hesitated to share with his friends. The Holy Eucharist and the Blessed Virgin were the two poles of his world of prayer. At the age of 17, he joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society and dedicated much of his spare time to serving the sick and the needy, caring for orphans, and assisting the demobilized servicemen returning from World War I. He decided to become a mining engineer, studying at the Royal Polytechnic University of Turin, so he could "serve Christ better among the miners," as he told a friend. Mountain climbing was one of his favorite sports. Outings in the mountains, which he organized with his friends, also served as opportunities for his apostolic work. He never lost the chance to lead his friends to Mass, to the reading of Scripture, and to praying the rosary. He often went to the theater, to the opera, and to museums. He loved art and music, and could quote whole passages of the poet Dante. Just before receiving his university degree, Pier Giorgio contracted poliomyelitis, which doctors later speculated he caught from the sick whom he tended. Neglecting his own health because his grandmother was dying, after six days of terrible suffering Pier Giorgio died at the age of 24 on July 4, 1925.

His last preoccupation was for the poor. On the eve of his death, with a paralyzed hand he scribbled a message to a friend, asking him to take the medicine needed for injections to be given to Converso, a poor sick man he had been visiting.

Pier Giorgio's funeral was a triumph. The streets of the city were lined with a multitude of mourners who were unknown to his family -- the poor and the needy whom he had served so unselfishly for seven years. Many of these people, in turn, were surprised to learn that the saintly young man they knew had actually been the heir of the influential Frassati family. Pope John Paul II, after visiting his original tomb in the family plot in Pollone, said in 1989: "I wanted to pay homage to a young man who was able to witness to Christ with singular effectiveness in this century of ours. When I was a young man, I, too, felt the beneficial influence of his example and, as a student, I was impressed by the force of his testimony." On May 20, 1990, in St. Peter's Square which was filled with thousands of people, the Pope beatified Pier Giorgio Frassati, calling him the "Man of the Eight Beatitudes." His mortal remains were found completely intact and incorrupt upon their exhumation on March 31, 1981; they were transferred from the family tomb in Pollone to the cathedral in Turin following his beatification in 1990.

Carlo Acutis was born May 3, 1991, in London, where his father was working. Just a few months later, he moved with his parents, Andrea Acutis and Antonia Salzano, to Milan, Italy. Carlo was diagnosed with leukemia as a teenager. Before his death in 2006, he offered his sufferings for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Church, saying: "I offer all of my suffering to the Lord for the pope and for the Church in

order not to go to purgatory but to go straight to heaven." From a young age, Carlo had a special love for God, even though his parents weren't especially devout. Antonia Salzano, his mom, said that before Carlo, she went to Mass only for her First Communion, her confirmation, and her wedding.

As a young child, Carlo loved to pray the rosary. After he made his First Communion, he went to Mass as often as possible at the parish across from his elementary school. Carlo's love for the Eucharist also inspired a deep conversion for his mother. According to the postulator promoting his cause for sainthood, he "managed to drag his relatives, his parents to Mass every day. It was not the other way around; it was not his parents bringing the little boy to Mass, but it was he who managed to get himself to Mass and to convince others to receive Communion daily."

Carlo's witness of faith as a child led adults to convert and be baptized. Carlo was not afraid to defend Church teaching, even in situations when his classmates disagreed with him. Many of Carlo's high school classmates remember Carlo giving a passionate defense for the protection of life from the moment of conception when there was a classroom debate about abortion. Carlo was a faithful friend. He was known for standing up for kids at school who got bullied, especially kids with disabilities. When a friend's parents were getting a divorce, Carlo made a special effort to include his friend in the Acutis' family life. With his friends, he spoke about the importance of going to Mass and confession, human dignity, and chastity.

Carlo was fascinated with computer coding and taught himself some of the basic coding languages, including C and C++. He used his computer skills and internet savvy to help his family put together an exhibition on Eucharistic miracles that has gone on to be displayed at thousands of parishes on five continents. Carlo loved playing video games. He had conversations with his gaming buddies about the importance of going to Mass and confession and limited his video game playing to no more than two hours per week. Carlo died on Oct. 12, 2006, and was buried in Assisi. Pope Francis recognized a second miracle attributed to Carlo's intercession in a decree on May 23, 2024.

Hundreds of thousands of pilgrims from around the world have visited Carlo's tomb since his canonization was announced. His remains rest in the Church of Santa Maria Maggiore at the Sanctuary of Spogliazione (or of the Stripping) in Assisi, the home of St. Francis and St. Clare.
